## Booking information

- ◆ All group visits, 'Meet & Greet' service, cream teas, lunches and guided tours must be pre-booked
- ◆ Payment: Cash or credit/debit card on the day of your visit or invoicing by prior arrangement

We can tailor your group visit, with village guided tours, boat trips around the bay, Clovelly Court garden guided tours, cream teas and lunches. The Land Rover service can be booked to take your group from the harbour to Clovelly Court Gardens and back to your coach.

## Overnight stays

If your group stays overnight at Clovelly during the summer months, there are other things to do, such as Silk Shop and Clovelly Pottery demonstrations, Owl Magic to handle owls and fly birds of prey, and Calming Quay holistic spa treatments.

## Other information

- ◆ You should allow around two to three hours for a visit, including a cream tea or lunch
- ◆ Please note that the High Street is steep and can be slippery – so visitors must be advised to wear sensible footwear

- ◆ The High Street is not suitable for wheelchairs. However, the Visitor Centre, donkey stables, craft workshops, Mount Pleasant and Clovelly Court Gardens are all wheelchair accessible, and make an enjoyable outing in themselves
- ◆ There are WCs for the disabled in the car park, at the Visitor Centre and at Clovelly Court Gardens

## Land Rover service (available Easter to October)

The walk down through Clovelly village to the harbour is hugely enjoyable. However, the village street is steep and cobbled, so if any people in your group do not want to walk back up, they can take the fare-paying Land Rover service back to the top. For the infirm, please ask the Visitor Centre reception to book a seat to take them down and back up, for which there is a charge separate to the normal admission fee.

## Directions

Clovelly is just off the A39, 10 miles west of Bideford. Exit the M5 at Junction 27.

## Coach parking

Drop off points immediately outside Clovelly Visitor Centre with parking close by.





This picturesque historic, fishing village promises visitors a wonderful half day out. Clovelly offers a calm reflection of the days when speed, noise and stress were not what they are today. It allows the visitor to relax and imbibe the spirit of a quiet community, focussed on the lives of its people rather than electronics and world economics. This atmosphere is embodied in a traffic-free cobbled street tumbling down the steep hill to the ancient fishing harbour, bringing glorious views and winding side alleyways of flower-bedecked cottages, with Clovelly's famous donkeys along the way.

There are many literary connections; **Charles Kingsley** lived here, **Charles Dickens** (right) wrote about it, J M Turner painted it and the artist Rex Whistler was inspired to draw a Clovelly design.



Our group admission rates are among the lowest in the West Country, and include coach parking, entry to the audio-visual film, two museums, Clovelly Court Gardens and a contribution to the preservation of this very special private estate.

## Clovelly, unique unforgettable



Clovelly is a unique village once owned by the Queen of England. From Elizabethan days until today it has been in private ownership, which has helped preserve its original atmosphere. It is unusual in that it has no cars on its streets, donkeys and sledges being the only form of transport along its cobbled ways. Its flower-strewn cottages tumble like a waterfall down a cleft in the 400-foot cliff to the tiny working port and 14th-century quay.

Its fascinating history, glorious views, traditional crafts, famous donkeys, two museums (Charles Kingsley and Fisherman's Cottage) are a few of Clovelly's attractions, while others lie hidden down tiny winding side alleys just waiting to be discovered.

### Visitor Centre

There are shops, a cafeteria and a must-see audio-visual film relating the history of the village before you visit the village.



### Clovelly Court Gardens

These gardens are next to the 13th-century parish church of All Saints at the top of the village. They are a classic

example of a restored Victorian walled kitchen garden with fruit, vegetables, colourful herbaceous borders and magnificent lean-to glasshouses sheltering Mediterranean fruits. Walk through a gate on to Clovelly Court Great Terrace and enjoy glorious views of Lundy and Bideford Bay on a clear day.

### New Inn

The 17th-century New Inn in the heart of the village has an Arts and Crafts theme with interior design in the style of the fabled English designer

William Morris. It has 8 en-suite bedrooms with village views or sea glimpses.

### Red Lion

The 18th-century Red Lion on the 14th-century harbour wall has 11 en-suite rooms with either a spectacular sea or harbour view. The adjacent Sail Loft provides 6 generous stylish bedrooms with wonderful sea views.



### Hamlyn Bed and Breakfast



This is opposite the New Inn, and has 11 bedrooms, some en-suite. It is planned to make all bedrooms en-suite. When staying there visitors have full use of the facilities at the New Inn.

Delicious lunches, dinners, local ales and ciders and Devon cream teas are served at both inns.
